

Transition Assessments Chart: Formal and Informal

Formal Assessments: Are systematic, data-based tests that measure what and how well the students have learned. They determine the students' proficiency or mastery of the content, and most often have standardized procedures that enable comparisons across groups of assessment takers.

Informal Assessments: Are content and performance driven; they measure students' performance and progress. Informal assessments are less structured and do not allow comparisons across groups of assessment takers.
