

### STAR

- For Potentially Eligible Students
  - More independent, self-directed, require fewer services or supports to be successful
- With disability documentation
  - Current IEP, 504, other
- Access to specific\* Pre-ETS are available
- Referrals come:
  - Public, charter, DJJ or
  - Self-referral (private or postsecondary education/training programs

### $\mathsf{VR}$

- Application and eligibility required
- Access to Pre-ETS and additional services based on employment goal which may include:
  - Supported employment
  - Time-limited treatment
  - Job placement assistance
  - Assistive technology and devices
  - Transportation

Postsecondary education or training



### Choosing the best Pathway

- Discuss with VR staff, student, family
- Look at disability documentation, specifically services, accommodations and modifications being accessed by the student
- Ask questions such as how much support is provided at home or in class on assignments, tests, homework to ensure success

### **VR Office Directory**

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Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) is a federal-state program that helps people who have physical or mental disabilities get or keep a job. VR is committed to helping people with disabilities find meaningful careers. Passage of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act further supports VR efforts to prepare youth for success in the 21st century workforce through our Transition Youth Services.

VR Transition Youth Services help students with disabilities train for a job, continue their education, or find a job after high school. Under this program, every youth will have the opportunity to participate in sponsored career counseling, work readiness training, and fully integrated work experiences in the community. These services are delivered while youth are still in high school and establish the foundation for a seamless transition to individualized training, education, and employment.

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### **STAR PROGRAM**



Under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), Pre-Employment Transition Services must be offered to students with disabilities without requiring them to apply for, or be determined eligible for, these services.

WIOA established VR as the primary agency for preparing youth with disabilities for employment while the youth are still in high school, including being able to access services while pursuing postsecondary education (trade, college, or university). VR will deliver specific Pre-Employment Transition Services including:

- Career Exploration Counseling
- · Work Readiness Training
- Self-Advocacy Training
- Postsecondary Educational Counseling
- · Community-Based Work Experiences

The students are not traditional VR customers, but have been referred to VR by school districts for limited (pre-employment transition) services.

Limitations on the Use of Subminimum Wage for YOUTH 24 and under



## Section 511 of WIOA-Limitations on Subminimum Wage for YOUTH

As of 7/22/16 Youth with disabilities 24 and younger are not eligible for Subminimum Wage Employment unless the youth has completed the following **three** requirements:

## Section 511 of WIOA-Limitations on Subminimum Wage for YOUTH

- 1. Transition services under IDEA and/or Pre-ETS under W.I.O.A
- Youth applied to VR and was:
  - a) found ineligible (<u>all VR policies</u> must be followed to close someone based on an ineligible determination) **or**
  - found eligible (if eligible they must develop an IPE and be provided services to assist to work towards an employment outcome-if not successful case can be closed)
- 3. Received Career Counseling Information and Referral Services from VR Counselor

### Required LEA Documentation

Information regarding receipt and completion of Pre-Employment or Transition Services should include:

- Name of Youth
- Description of Service or Activity Completed, including name of provider, date services completed, and signature of personnel documenting the completion
- Signature of person transmitting the documents
- Date and method of delivery (e.g., hand-delivered, faxed, emailed, etc.) by which document was transmitted to the youth or VR Counselor

## The Mystery of the Sought After 14 (C) Letter

A letter from VR documenting that a youth has met all of the required elements. This letter is required before a youth can be hired to participate in subminimum wage employment.

# Additional Information of Interest

The law does not apply to youth 24 and younger who:

- Are not pursuing subminimum wage employment
- May work in sheltered workshops or for a 14 (C) employer if they are going to be paid minimum wage or higher
- May participate in adult day training programs that offer nonwage, meaningful day training activities
