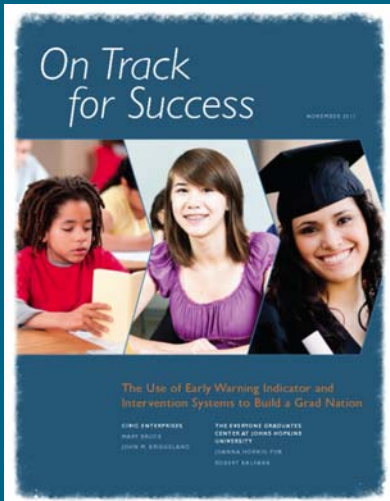
## Early Warning Systems

Early warning systems (EWS) use available school data to identify students who are at risk of not graduating from or dropping out of school to facilitate early intervention. The EWS data can also be used at the state and district levels to examine school-level trends to identify and address systemic issues.

*On Track for Success: The Use of Early Warning Indicator and Intervention Systems to Build a Grad Nation*

## Governor Rick Scott signed Senate Bill 850

Governor Rick Scott signed SB 850, an act relating to education, into law with an effective date of June 20, 2014. It revises educational programs related to:

- Juvenile justice education
- The Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program
- Middle school accountability
- The Florida College System
- Students with disabilities by repealing the Special Diploma and creating alternative pathways for students with disabilities to earn a standard high school diploma

The bill also established the Florida Personal Learning Account for students with disabilities in kindergarten through 12th grade, to provide funding for certain educational and specialized services. SB 850 may be viewed online <http://laws.fl.gov/2014/184>.
