School-Based Enterprise

School-Based Enterprise (SBE)

A school-based enterprise is a set of entrepreneurial activities developed and implemented by students. Working closely with the teacher, the students plan, implement and evaluate their business venture. The goal of a school-based enterprise is to assist students with skills and experiences that lead to independence and self-employment or small business start-ups. These skills also transfer easily to any real world work opportunity.

There are three phases to the process starting with planning. They are detailed in Project 10: Transition Education Network's, School-Based Enterprise Development: Planning, Implementing and Evaluating Guide. This guide can be found on the Project 10 website at www.Project10.info. Teachers can use this guide to systematically implement a school-based enterprise with their students.



Titusville High School in Brevard County opened its first school-based enterprise this year. With the support of school administration, district staff and a county commissioner the Titusville Coffee Pit has become a reality.

The Coffee Pit is operated by students that are age 18-22 years old and are working toward a special diploma. Students learn the basics of business and employment through operating this school-based enterprise. The Coffee Pit serves coffee to government building staff and visitors four hours per day and is located at the County Government building.

On October 16, 2013, the Council for Exceptional Children (CEC) highlighted this endeavor in their National CEC SmartBrief. The local *Florida Today Newspaper* attended the opening and covered the opening day activities including serving the first cup of coffee to County Commissioner Robin Fisher of Titusville. Superintendent Brian Binggeli was also on hand to support the opening day.
