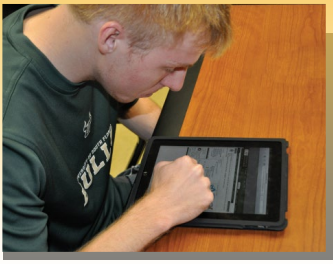

Who is the Consortium? The University of Central Florida (UCF) has partnered with the University of South Florida St. Petersburg (USFSP), Florida International University (FIU), and Florida State College at Jacksonville (FSCJ) to form the Florida Consortium on Inclusive Higher Education.

The Consortium's Mission is to increase postsecondary education opportunities for individuals with intellectual disabilities through the enhancement and expansion of inclusive postsecondary education programs throughout the state of Florida.



Universal Design for Learning Module

This Universal Design for Learning (UDL) Module, is a FREE resource located on the www.FLTPSID.info website. It was created specifically for post-secondary educators. UDL provides a blueprint from which educators create curriculum, lessons, and instruction, to enable all students equal access to learning.

Educators are able to increase their flexibility and accessibility of instruction, for all students, through the three UDL components of (a) multiple representations of content, (b) multiple forms of expression, and (c) multiple options for engagement (HEOA, 2008; National Center on Universal Design for Learning, 2014).

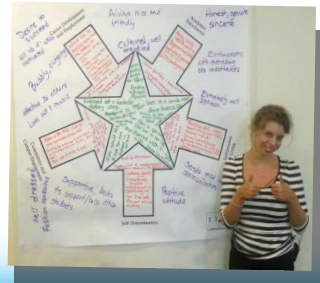

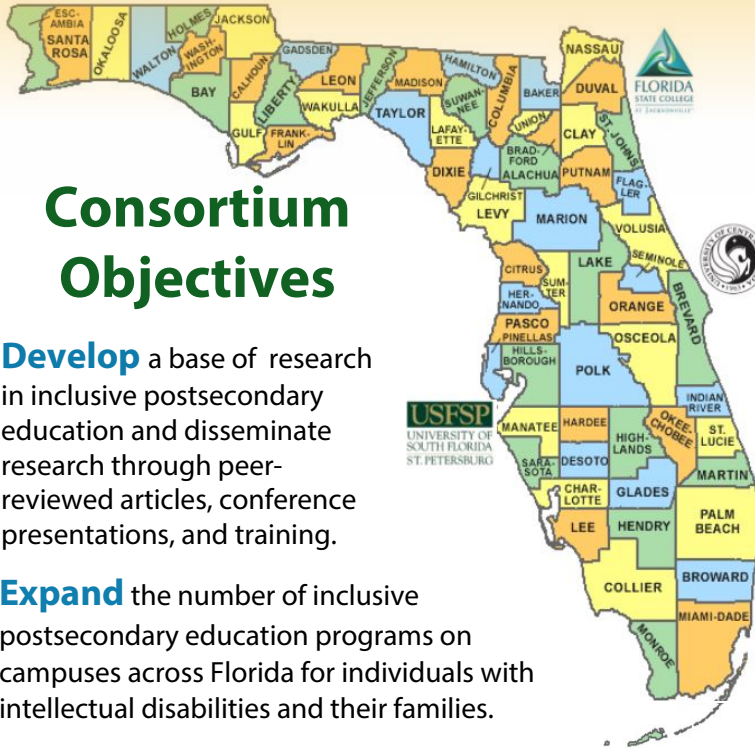
With the individual as the focus, solutions are crafted to fit their needs and goals rather than fitting the individual into the service or program goals.

Expand the number of inclusive postsecondary education programs on campuses across Florida for individuals with intellectual disabilities and their families.

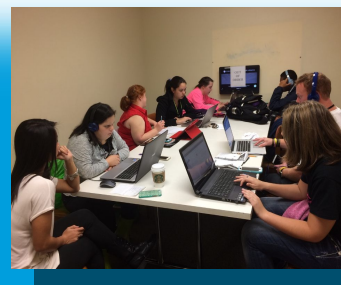
Collaborate with all Florida postsecondary programs for students with intellectual disabilities and other key stakeholders to facilitate alignment of curriculum and credentialing among institutions.

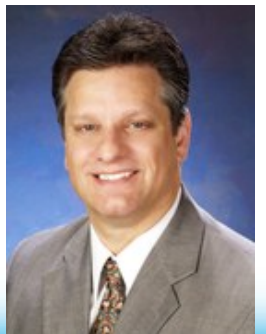
Students with intellectual disabilities, enrolled in CTP certified programs, are eligible for federal financial assistance such as scholarships, work study, and Pell grants.

Annual Hartwick Symposium

The Hartwick Symposium, sponsored by the FCIHE, is an opportunity for Florida stakeholders to come together to share ideas and build on the mission to enhance and expand inclusive postsecondary education for students with intellectual disabilities in Florida. As diverse as our communities, these stakeholders include educators and mentors from Florida's universities, community and state colleges, and career and technical colleges, enrolled students with intellectual disabilities and their families, and community businesses, agencies, and members.

Hartwick focuses on emerging, innovative, and promising practices within the field of inclusive postsecondary education (IPSE) for students with intellectual disabilities.

Dr. Hartwick, one of Lynn University's "Journey of Hope" members, lost his life in the 2010 Haiti earthquake. He is remembered for his advocacy for education and uncompromising commitment to making a difference in the lives of students and educational institutions.



Dr. Hartwick dedicated his life to ensuring that every student had the opportunity to reach their potential as students and citizens.

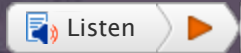
